#### Design and Access Statement for Householders in Conservation Areas.

Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

Town and Country Planning(General Development Procedure)Order 1995

In conservation areas it is necessary to submit a design and access statement to show that any development within the curtilage of a dwelling is compatible with the design of the main dwelling and surrounding development.

This form is to provide the minimum information to demonstrate the acceptability of the design.

- 1 Describe the setting and design of the main dwelling, any other buildings in the curtilage and the surrounding development.

There is one main dwelling originally (17th century with workshop) built of limestone & grit with an original rendering to the gable end and Tor St side. During restoration, new foundations to Bach-Tor St side, rebuilding of facade in reclaimed stone, iron work, reclaimed tiles, were used. Windows all hard wood double glazing.

- 2 Explain how the proposal relates to the main dwelling and to the other buildings in the area, the street scene. Give details of the proposed external materials, walls, roof, doors windows, any hard surfacing or hard standing.

There is no proposal to change the dimensions to the main dwelling. We built the two cottages in the Mews in 1991 - we replaced the cobbled gardens & the garden, with no parking - only on the front of the cottages. road side of the wall, off street.

Proposed external materials - reclaimed stone & iron garden steps.

- 3 Explain any measures proposed to protect the amenity of neighbours.

There will be no change to the amenity of neighbours as we built it originally to the planning laws at the time. I do the gardening & the tidy up of community area.

- 4 Describe the existing access to the dwelling and any proposed changes to it.

The existing access is parking for one vehicle as it is for 2 cottages. a total of 3. Tor St off street. one vehicle Bach-Tor St. Pedestrian access from both ends. Pedestrian access only from Sr-Jones St.

My main concern about the area is the dustbins. I have provided an area away from the 2 cottages but the mere dustbins we have to have the front doors open as the wall Bach-Tor St is coming down - now is the time to do it.
