

Retention Category A:
Trees whose retention is most desirable.
Vigorous healthy tree of good form, free from obvious faults and of significant amenity value

Retention Category B:

Trees whose retention is desirable. Trees which are in a moderate to good condition although some minor faults may require correction by ___surgery.

Retention Category C:
Trees whose condition is moderate to poor and usually require a significant amount of tree surgery or be located in an area not readily

accessible to the public.

Retention Category U:


Trees & shrubs which are dead, dying or dangerous. Trees which are so damaged and diseased as to be incapable of further satisfactory development. Trees in this category should be removed.



The survey methodology is adopted from that contained in BS 5837:2012 'Guides to Trees in Relation to Construction'. The trees are assigned retention categories on the basis of their general form, health, and amenity value.
