

## Design and Access Statement, The Fallow Deer, Chapel En Le Frith

Foresters way, Chapel En Le Frith, SK23 ORB

The Fallow deer is a pub and restaurant catering for all types of customers, locals, families, businessmen and tourists.

It has a bar, restaurant, external patio seating, garden area and parking facilities.

## The Proposal

To form a small extension to the external patio, to have a direct access when required from the restaurant through new bi fold doors and an awning to provide shelter when necessary.

The extension of the patio being proposed is to be formed in materials matching the existing patio area.

The new bi fold doors proposed are to sit within the existing window opening, just with the removal of the sill and riser, to fit in with the look of the façade. The benefit of the doors in summer months to give easy access for customers and staff to the outside areas, and when opened connecting the two spaces.

The purpose of the extension of patio is to allow the proposed awning to sit centrally on the gable end and to the bi fold doors, for ascetical reasons.

The awning gives customers added protection and also extends the period of usage, which is beneficial to the commercial success of the premises.

The design allows the awning to be folded away when not in use, being more discreet and also practical in windy weather.
