9 Design Principles and Concepts Applied to the Proposal

The complex is an old farm site and the overall feel of the site is that of a farmyard. The design is that of a stone built farm type shed/store room with full height opening to represent doors. These are glazed to give the kind of light required for a swimming pool.

Heritage type roof lights are also used to maintain the old farm appearance.
